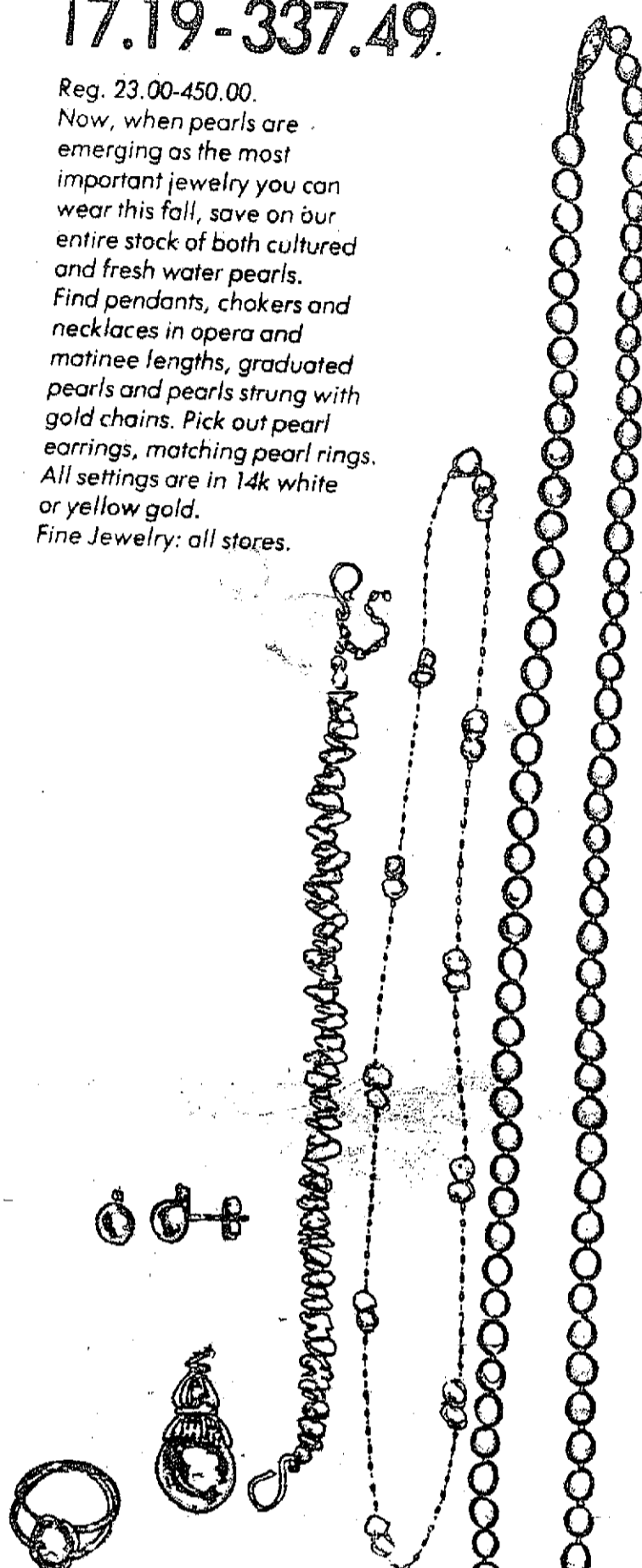

# State sets waterfowl hearing

This year's public hearing concerning waterfowl hunting seasons and bag limits will be held in Annapolis on Aug. 23 beginning at 10:30 a.m. in the cafeteria of the Tawes State Office Building, 580 Taylor Ave., across from the Navy-Marine Corps Stadium.

Following the hearing, the Maryland Wildlife Administration and the Wildlife Advisory Commission will make final selections of dates and bag limits based on the final guidelines established by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and on public comments recorded at the hearing.

According to Bernard F. Halla, Wildlife Administration director, Annapolis was chosen for this year's public hearing because it is more centrally located and is the seat of the Wildlife Administration.

In addition, the Wildlife Advisory Commission unanimously agreed that one hearing instead of two would provide the opportunity for all interested persons to hear all the testimony at the same time.

Details of proposed dates and bag limits for this year's duck and goose hunting seasons will be released for consideration prior to the Aug. 23 hearing.

# DOE plans seminar on energy rules

The Department of Energy will conduct a seminar to familiarize building owners and operators with mandatory temperature levels for non-residential buildings on Aug. 22. The seminar will begin at 9 a.m. in the Cavalier Room of the Lord Baltimore Hotel in Baltimore. Technical Assistance will be provided by the American Society of Heating, and by refrigerating and air conditioning engineers.

Some of the subjects to be discussed are Type 1 and Type 2 Systems, measurement techniques, domestic hot water and compliance forms.

The temperature restrictions involve all non-residential buildings with exemptions for hospitals and health care facilities, elementary schools and day-care centers, lodging portions of hotels and other lodging facilities.

The restrictions are a part of President Carter's effort to reduce energy consumption and to help stem the flow of imported oil. The program is designed to reduce oil consumption by as much as 400,000 barrels per day.

# Army captain awarded medal

# Drawbridge to close during race Aug. 26

The Severn Park Funrunners will use the bridge that day as part of a 10-mile run to benefit the American Heart Association.

# State to buy 49 acres for Severn Run park

Sen. Charles McC. Mathias Jr., R-Md., has announced the awarding of a \$174,228 grant which will enable the state of Maryland to purchase 49 additional acres of land for Severn Run State Park.

The state government will match the federal funds to bring the project total to \$348,456.

The grant is from the U.S. Department of the Interior's Heritage Conservation and Recreation Service.
