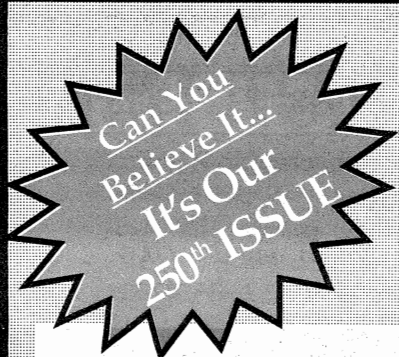




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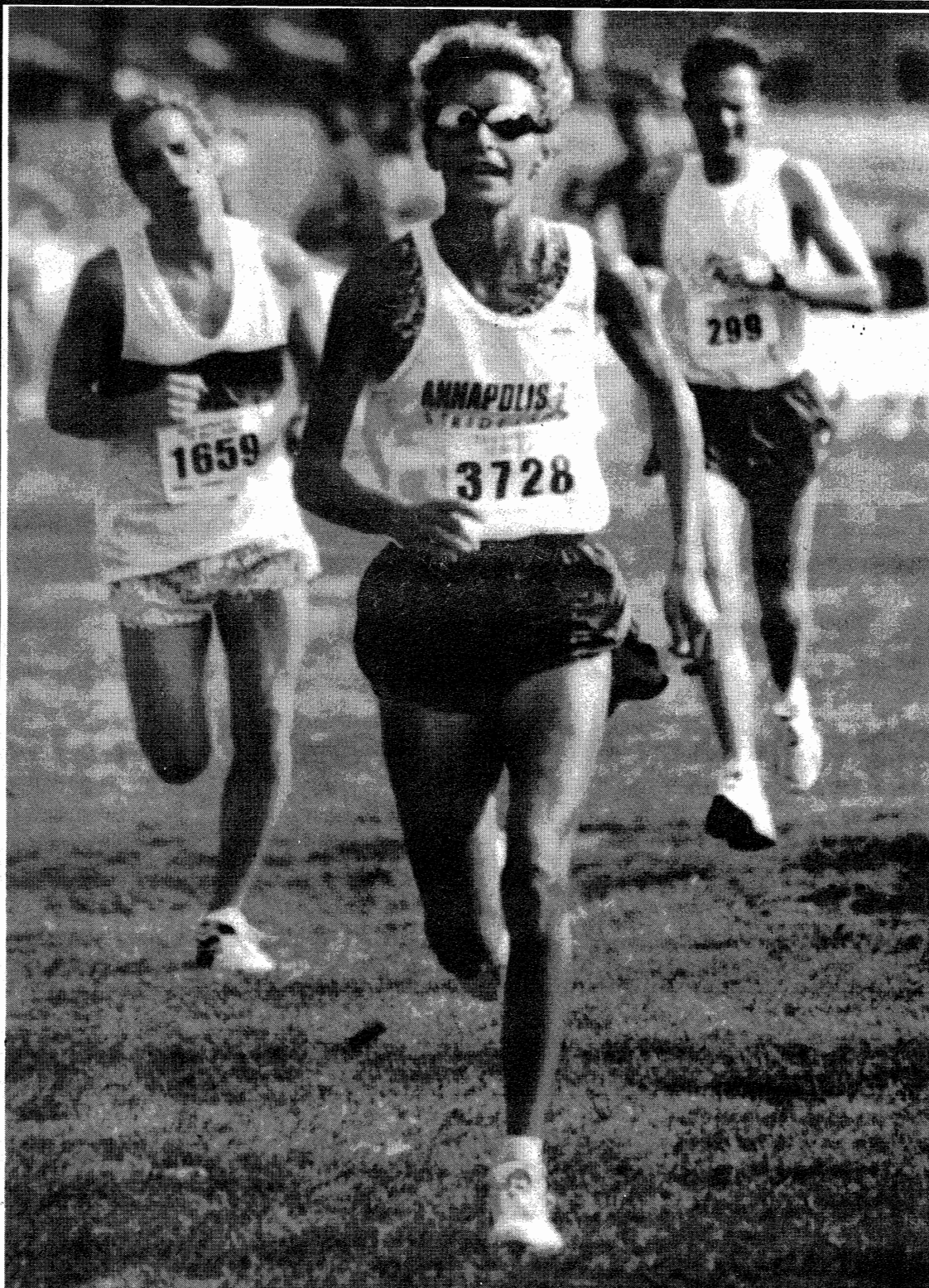

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Hausenfluck and Bandiera-Stewart Beat the Heat

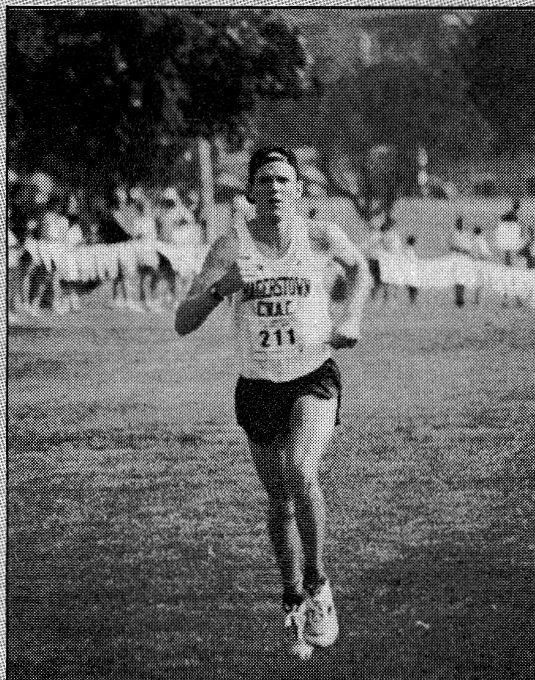

ANNAPOLIS, MD—It's 80 feet high and 2,835 feet long—the Severn River Bridge awaited the runners of the 23rd Annapolis Ten-Mile Run (August 30, 1998). The weather conditions were normal, hot and humid. Atop the bridge overlooking the U.S. Naval Academy, with minutes ticking away, a flashing light could be seen along the sea wall on the Academy grounds at the five-mile mark. The pack of runners was making its way along the wall. From the distance they were only specks. The real race was about to begin as the runners exited the Academy and reached the foot of the bridge about a half-mile down the road. The race was half over but strategy was going to count.

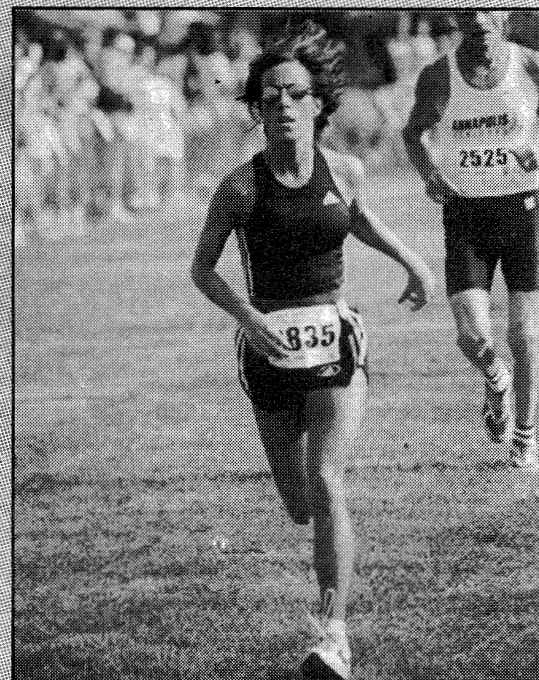
The event is billed as Maryland's Premier 10-Mile Road Race. The locals know it for the hills, heat, and humidity and as a test of skills and wills. The event served as the Maryland State RRCA 10-Mile Championship and the RRCA Eastern Regional Championship. The awards go to the first place male and female finishers, Open and Masters. The start and finish of the event was the Navy-Marine Corps Stadium.

The first participant to hit the bridge was Tom Gorman (Littlestown, PA), a wheelchair athlete. The pull was difficult. The wheels turned slowly as Gorman's hands maneuvered the small wheels alongside the chair. Once at the crest it was full steam ahead downhill. There was no competition.

At the base of the bridge with 26:07, the leader and defending champion (53:13-1997), Merrill Hausenfluck (Silver Spring, MD) had a decisive lead of about twenty-five yards. The situation was a repeat of last year. The race was under control as Hausenfluck looked relaxed once he was at the crest of the bridge.

Giving chase was Yancey Hall (Arlington, VA) and ten yards back was Gary O'Donnell (Arlington). Another ten yards back was last year's fifth-place finisher (55:30), Patrick Reed (Annapolis), holding down fourth place.

The sun was bright and the effect of the heat could be seen on the faces of the runners as they climbed the bridge. The race among the females was getting intense as returning runners were out to better positions and times. The clock rolled over to thirty minutes as the lead female was in sight. Lisa Bandiera-Stewart (Annandale, VA), looked smooth and in full control. Bandiera-Stewart finished in eighth place last year (1:04:56). Pulling in second was Hilary Cairns (Washington, DC) who finished last year in third (1:02:29), and in third was Vanessa Cox (Laurel, MD) who placed sixth last year (1:03:56). Close on the heels of Cox was Jennifer Flint (Malvern, PA) who finished last year in

fourth place (1:02:31).

The journey continued as hundreds of runners made their assault on the bridge to face more hills in miles six through eight. The bridge had to be crossed on the return. The last two miles gave the runners a chance to use all remaining energy to recover and race against the clock.

Hausenfluck was on a mission and no ground was given up in the last half of the race. There was no pack, only a string of runners wishing for something to happen. Hausenfluck was allowed to get away and he wasn't going back. The pace and pressure continued as Hausenfluck captured back-to-back wins with 53:13. The event record was set in 1982 at 48:43 by Gary Siriano (Pittsburgh, PA).

"It always feels good to win a decent size race. The first four miles there was a pack of three. I felt fine from the waist up. I like the course off the bridge where you can open up a lead. It was the strongest part of my race," said winner Hausenfluck who works for Cyntergy and runs for Brooks. He is a member of the Cumberland Valley Athletic Club (CVAC).

"During the race you think about the bridge. The Naval Academy is wide open and hot. It's good to get that out of the way. At mile seven I felt rubbery-legged and if I needed to react I could. Overall I am very pleased, less excited about the time," commented Hausenfluck.

There was a turn of events along the course as Gary O'Donnell worked up to capture second place with 54:45 while Dave Wall (Riva, MD) captured third with 55:17. Yancey Hall faded back to fourth with 55:36.

The first Masters and fifth position was captured by Anthony Basile (Columbia, MD) with 55:42. The second Masters was James Pryde (Churchville, MD) with 56:36 (7th overall). In 1994 Pryde set the Masters event record at 53:48. Third was captured by Robert Drysdale (Oxford, MD) with 58:39 (14th place).

"If I didn't stay with [Pryde] I didn't have a chance at mile five. My goal was to be the top Masters. Every race I go to I meet new Masters. I was concerned that he may come back. I just kept focused on the guy in front," said Masters winner Basile.

"I graduated from the Academy in 1983 where I ran cross-country. It's a tough part of the course [the bridge]. I knew it was going to be tough. I kept thinking about it from mile seven," added Basile.

"I was hoping that they flattened the bridge. It was the usual; I felt good for five miles. The second half was tough. I was trying to run 58 minutes. I always like to be competitive. In six months I'll be worried about what other people do," said runner-up Masters, Pryde (first in the 45-49 age group).

The lead female was in sight still in control. Bandiera-Stewart captured first with 1:03:03. The event record was set in 1982 at 56:12 by Eleanor Simonsick. In another change of events, Jennifer Flint managed to work up to capture second place with 1:03:29. Hilary Cairns captured third with 1:04:21.

"I was running with a broken toe. My five-mile time was 30:56. I was thinking, 'Oh my God, you have to keep it up.' Coming back across the bridge and hearing the crowd was a great feeling," said Bandiera-Stewart.

"I was concerned about another person coming up since I didn't know who was behind me. I was trying to listen to the times being called out," added Bandiera-Stewart.

"It was a great race. My whole club runs [Valley Forge Striders]. My first mile was 6:25. At mile seven I was given a gift, the girl [Cairns] in front of me stopped and walked. I didn't go out to be competitive but when someone in front of you starts to walk, you can't walk away from it," said runner-up, Flint.

"I was frustrated because I haven't had a good race in a while. I started to feel a chill and I stopped to walk

and I walked twice. I'm glad that I did. I had some slow miles. I like this race a lot," said third-place Cairns.

Fourth was captured by Vanessa Cox with 1:04:36. Jackie MacDonald (Washington, DC) placed fifth with 1:05:22.

The first Masters and seventh overall was Rose Malloy (Annapolis) with 1:06:45. The Masters record was set in 1991 (1:00:36) by Malloy. Malloy has captured more Masters wins than any other runner in this event: 1989 (1:00:43), 1990 (1:00:40) the female winner that year, 1992 (1:00:45), and 1994 (1:04:25). In addition, Malloy was first in the 50-54 age group.

"I'm 50 and I'm happy to be 50 and I'm happy to be running. This is like running for the hometown crowd. I've ran at least ten of these. I was running my own race and I don't kill myself anymore. I race the way that I want to. I was injured and it's a thrill to be back running," said Masters winner, Malloy.

Second went to Carla Pastore (Severna Park, MD) with 1:09:09 (15th place). Laura Roman (Baltimore) was third with 1:09:35 (22nd place).

The wheelchair winner was Tom Gorman with 48:51. The event record was set in 1991 at 37:31 by Kenny Carnes. Philip Cephas (Washington) was second with 1:33:42.

The Pat O'Brien Award (7th year) is presented to the first female Anne Arundel finisher in memory of a fellow Annapolis Strider. Vanessa Cox was this year's recipient.

Sisters on the road from Bowie, MD took home awards. Krystle Behrns, age 13, captured second in the age group 14 and under with 1:34:47. Sister, Nicole, age 16, captured first in 15-19 with 1:18:39.

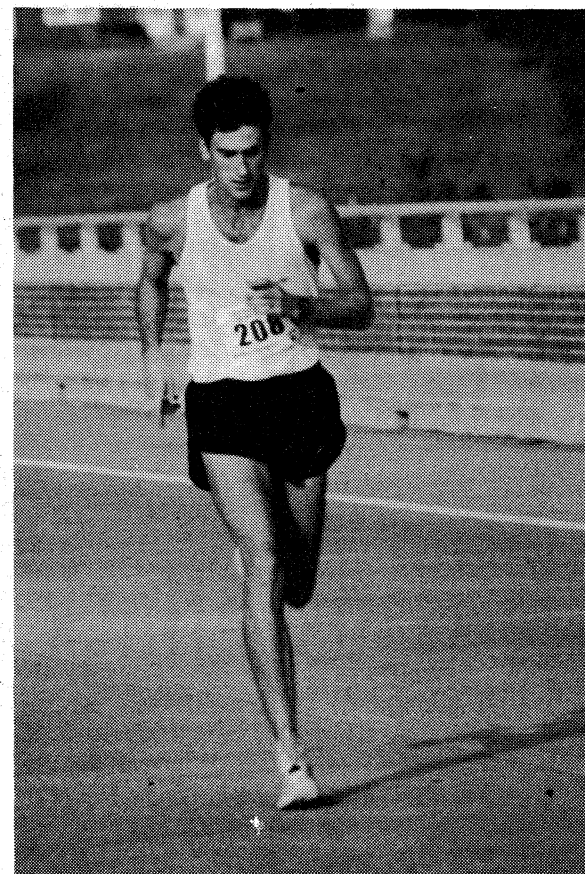
Some of the sponsors put their support on the road. WBAL-TV (Baltimore) had four runners in the pack to give some first-hand feedback. Announcer Audrey Barnes completed the event in 1:40:44 along with Ed Kiernan (1:16:36), Tom Tasselmeyer (1:21:44) and Justin Berk.

"It was the toughest ten-mile time. The hills seem steeper, continually going up and down. The first part is easier. I gave it my all but I felt thoroughly exhausted," said Dixon Hemphill (Fairfax Station, VA), winner of the 70-74 age group with 1:21:40. In second was Bill Morrison (Rockville, MD) with 1:28:19.

Kay Morrison was first in 70-74 with 1:49:05. In the tradition of ruling the roads with an outstanding performance was Hedy Marque (Alexandria, VA) with 1:41:08. The age of 81 is not the focus, but instead it's the level of performance. Marque continues to dominate the event each year.

"I didn't place today. I have cancer which is in remission, but I'll see you at the Marine Corps Marathon," said third-place finisher in the 75-79 age group, Hubert Morgan (Mountain Top, PA), age 76, with 1:49:54.

The Maryland RRCA team competition was dominated by the Baltimore Road Runners with 39 points (J. Pryde, K. Prem, M. Woodman, S. Kortenkamp, T. Lanahan). The Annapolis Striders captured second with 49 points. The D.C. Road Runners Club was third with 75 points.

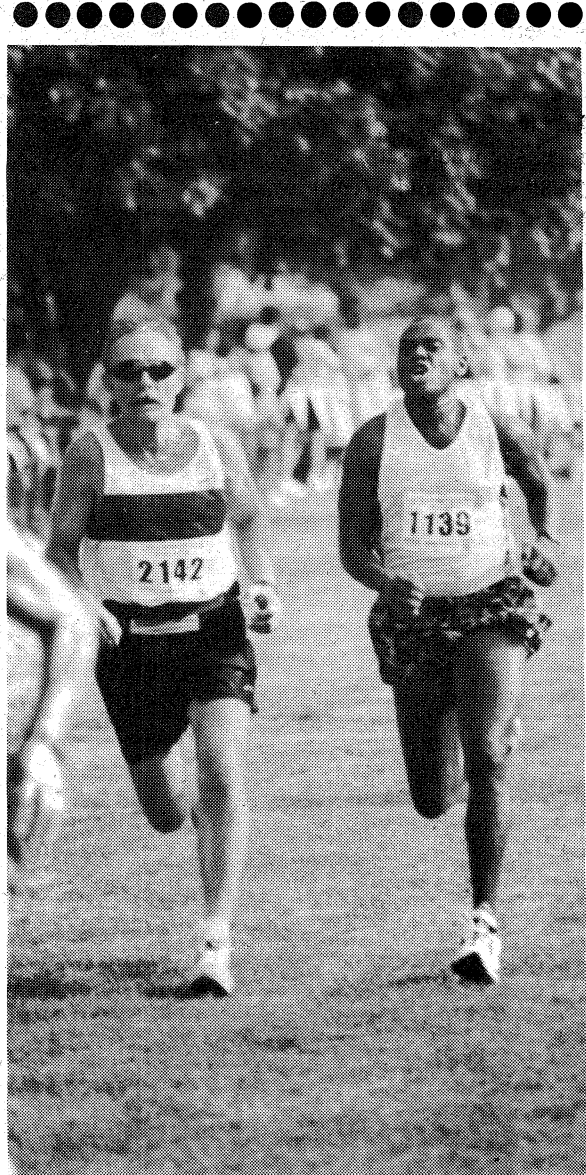
